Arrive on time

We believe it is important for all students to be at school on time so that all students follow the entire lesson. It is very disruptive for the teacher and the other children if children come in during class.

The Netherlands has a compulsory education law. This means that children from the age of 5 must attend school and be at school on time.

At the intake of new pupils, compulsory education is mentioned and the importance of being on time. The International Language Classes information booklet also contains this information.

The school door opens at 8.20 am. Between 8.20 and 8.30, children enter the school.

At 8.30 the door closes. The teachers start their lessons at 8.30. Children who are late should ring the bell. The teacher records in our system that the child is late.

After 3 times late, the teacher contacts the parents/carers.

After 6x tardies, the teacher notifies the location leader and contacts parents.

After 9x tardies, the teacher notifies the location leader and administration. We will make a report to the school attendance officer. He will contact you. You may then be fined.

Together, we hope to ensure that we can start class on time. .
